

First of all, you should know that this is not the first time I've been to Germany: the first time was for my M1 internship. So, my feelings are a bit "biased" because I'm in the same city and studying at the same institute as during my internship. But with time and the events that the institute organized, I was finally able to make friends with a few people. But the path to get there was definitely not easy, and I often felt alone.

After my internship, I was able to travel around the country for 2-3 weeks, which allowed me to discover the big cities and the culture of each region and to better "integrate" into its landscape, so to speak.
